

<u>From The</u> President's Desk

MID-SUMMER UPDATE

Summer is going by too quickly, as usual. I hope you have all been enjoying the break.

The ACT Staff has been working on various issues and problems, including grievances, as well as answering teachers' questions on any number of topics. Below is an update of many of the items on which we have been working.

The Constriction numbers have improved a bit. At the present time, fifteen teachers are still without permanent positions. There should be some additional retirements and resignations during August, and, hopefully, some schools will receive additional teachers. We would like to see everyone back to work by September.

On June 19, the Association's Executive Board wrote to the CEO of the Faith in the Future Foundation in regard to his 5,3,2,1 Plan with its goal of student happiness but no mention of Catholic identity or Gospel values. All ACT members received a copy of the letter. To date, there has been quite a bit of positive reaction to my letter from teachers, but, strangely, no response of any kind from the CEO of the Foundation, the Foundation or anyone from the Archdiocese or the School System.

FROM THE PRESIDENT. . .

There were a number of questions from teachers, and rightly so, when the Archdiocese published its financial report for 2011-2012, showing a sizable Lay Employees' Retirement Plan shortfall. The ACT Staff had met with Tim O'Shaughnessy, the Archdiocesan CFO, who had told us about the upcoming report. ACT's representative on the Pension Board of Trustees had also informed us of what had happened. Both Mr. O'Shaughnessy and Ellen Donato informed us that the Trustees had taken action as soon as they were aware of the shortfall. One thing they did was to increase the contribution rate from the parishes, agencies and schools.

As soon as the report was released, ACT contacted the Vice Chairman of the Pension Board and requested a copy of the latest actuarial statement as well as the annual audit. We now have the actuarial statement and will receive a copy of the audit for 2012-13 when it has been completed. ACT's attorney is also reviewing the documents.

The Association is being told that the Archdiocese is expecting a muchimproved report for 2012-2013. We will continue to monitor the Plan and will get information to you as it becomes available to us.

On July 23, Irene and I had lunch with the new Secretary for Catholic Education, Christopher Mominey. Both the lunch and the conversation were enjoyable. It was, basically, a getting-to-know-you time.

Just a reminder to everyone about the August 28 local school In-Service Day. By contract, this day is added as of this year as part of the 190 days. Since this is a professional development day, I contacted the Superintendent to ask about Act 48 credits. I was told that there will be a minimum of 3 hours and possibly more depending upon the programs run in the individual schools.

As we prepare to return to our students, please be aware that this will be a negotiating year. I have spoken with everyone who is part of Archdiocesan decision-making about the benefits of an Early Bird contract this time around. We will be formalizing the request in early fall.
