

EARLY BIRD NEGOTIATIONS OPEN

Negotiations 2014 are officially underway. The Association and the System exchanged proposals on Monday, February 24. The opening session was coupled with a dinner for both Teams which both the Secretary for Catholic Education and the Superintendent attended.

The first working session will be an all-day meeting on March 20, followed by another all-day session on March 27.

In its Opening Statement, the Association spoke of being "happy with both the new format for negotiations (the Early Bird) and the new attitude and atmosphere between us." This message was communicated as well in the Joint Letter which the Association and the System sent to all teachers and administrators.

The Association pointed out that "the proposals we present to you today are reasonable and have come from our members through their contract surveys. The teachers told us what they wanted and needed. They voted approval of these proposals at the General Membership Meeting."

The Statement made it clear that "No one wants a repeat of 2011. You have the Association's assurance that we will do everything we can to reach a mutual agreement by the end of May, 2014."

ACT has its "A" Team assembled and I am very fortunate to have Irene Tori, John Zoccola, Joe Schuler and Tom Imburgia with me at the bargaining table.

A copy of the ACT Proposals has been sent to each school for posting. The topics presented by the System include "Salaries and Benefits, Dates for Bumping, Extended Leave, Lesson Planning, Teacher Presence at Start and End of Day and When Administrative Openings Occur."

As we work toward the May settlement date, ACT will be emailing updates to you, our members, on the progress of negotiations.

Please keep both Teams and the successful completion of the Early Bird in your prayers.





FSA REMINDER

If you were a participant in the 2013 FSA Program, please remember that all monies in your account should have been exhausted by **December 31**, **2013**. Any funds that remained in your account after December 31, 2013 have been lost to you. However, this does not mean that all your eligible expenses had to be submitted by December 31, 2013. You have **90 days** after the close of the calendar year in which to submit eligible expenses for 2013. All eligible expenses for 2013 must be submitted by **March 30**, **2014**.

Seniority Lists Posted (for school only)

Article V, Section 1b states "On or before April 1 of each school year, the Secondary School System shall supply to the Association and shall post in each school a complete listing of all full-time teachers in that school including those on approved leaves of absence arranged according to school seniority."

"Teachers shall have until May 1 to call attention in writing to errors or file grievances with the local school administration concerning their positions on the seniority roster."


